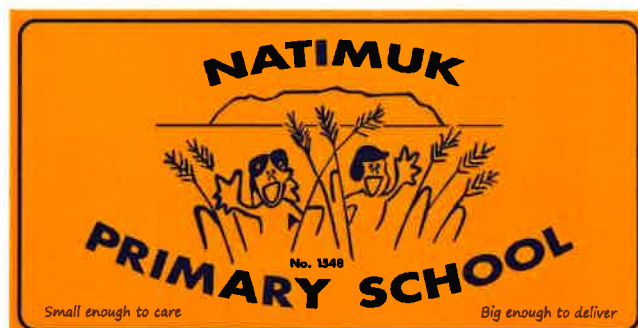

In Music we are preparing some music items to share with the residents of the nursing home in a couple of weeks.

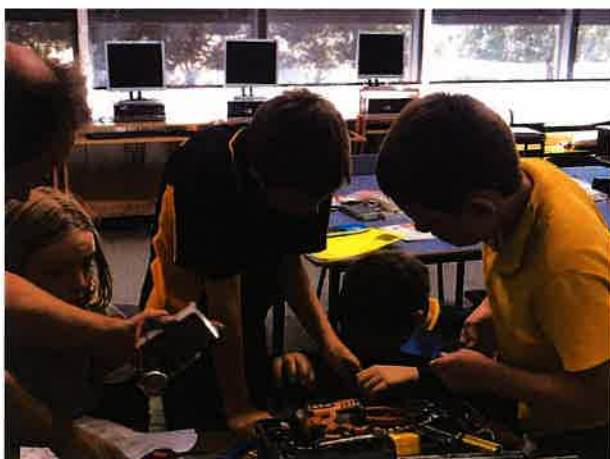


## Mrs Clarkson
