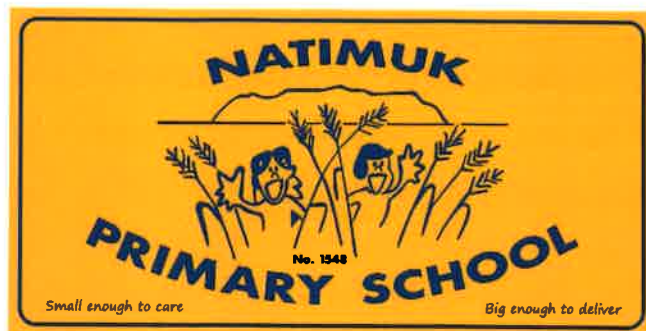

This week in Literacy students have been writing narratives. We went through what makes a good story including characters, setting, problem and how the problem is solved. Students have written their introduction and what the problem is, they will now be writing how the problem is solved.

In Integrated Studies we have been learning a number of Nursery Rhymes. Last week we learnt Little Miss Muffet. Students made a web and then made a spider to go on it. They wrote about where Little Miss Muffet ran off to once the spider had scared her. Some interesting ideas were running to Coles, running home through the dark woods and running home to her cosy bed.

In Wellbeing this week all students made vanilla cupcakes with frosting. The older students made a batch and 2 lots of frosting. The younger students made a batch of cupcakes and decorated them all. They were very tasty and we had them for playlunch.

The year 3-4s have some new furniture- a second couch and a drink bottle table, and some decorations- a full set of AFL jumpers hanging from the rafters, in anticipation of the footy season that's about to start. Go Cats!

There was no Science this week but next Monday we'll explore the properties of gases, hopefully pleasant ones!

In Fitness the children have learnt a couple of new games, Danger 123 and Link-tag which is always a winner.

This week we have started writing narratives, which means the students can let their imaginations run free, (a few of them need no encouragement) ☺ We'll learn what makes a story better to read and hopefully unearth some literary gems. In reading the 3s are exploring "Under the Ocean" and the 4s are finding out what adventure awaits Alicia. We will also have a lesson on how to use a dictionary efficiently.

In Maths we have learnt about lines of symmetry, how to read a compass and grid references on a map, horizontal vertical and oblique lines, and today we worked on addition using the split strategy. They've also been practising a new warm-up game called Flipper, and discovered that accuracy is more important than speed.

In Literacy we are focusing on finishing our reports on Federation. Federation is our topic for Integrated Studies and will form our display at the Natimuk Show. Each of the older students have a person to research. The person has had some influence on Federation in some way. The year 3s have been finding out about Captain Cook and the discovery of Australia.
