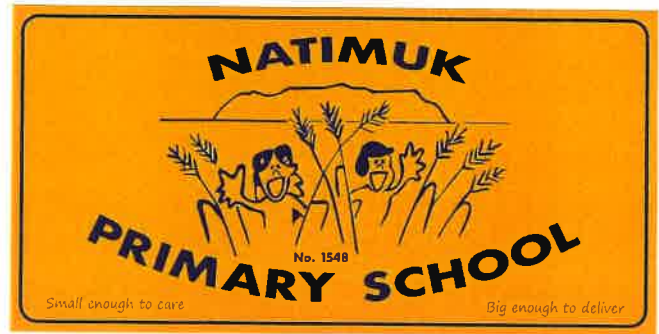

NAPLAN

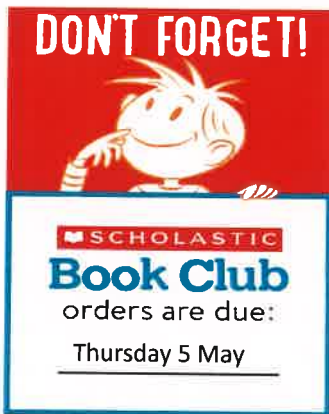
