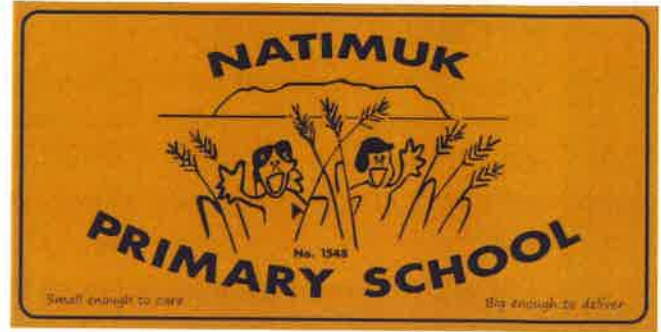

In Integrated Studies, students have almost finished their unit on Celebrations from around the world. The last couple of session have been about Fourth of July in the USA and Hanukkah, a Jewish celebration. Students have enjoyed the unit, travelling on a plane each week to the destination and getting their passport stamped as well.
