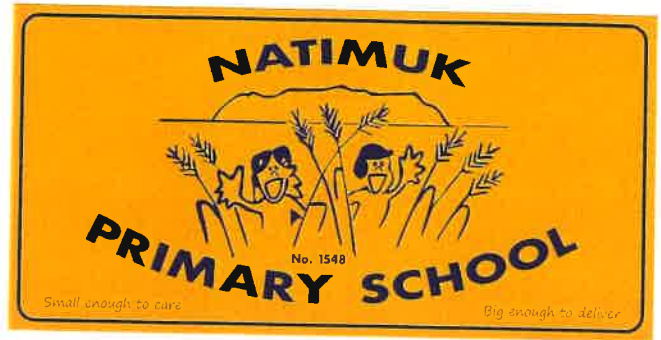

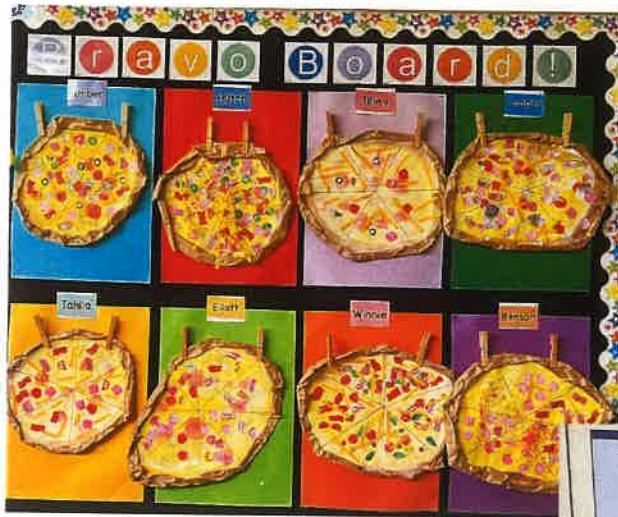

It was hard to get the hang of how to set up players when the ball is being brought down the court. The P-2 students finished their unit on kick, playing a few different games when they had to kick balls to knock over the cones.

### Mrs Hausler

We have worked hard in Literacy over the past week to finish our life cycle explanation texts. These are a great read and are making their way to the display board in the hallway. We have focused on *Features Flamingo* in reading, discussing the importance of taking in all information presented in non-fiction texts, including graphics, charts, photographs, captions etc. We are also enjoying literacy group activities and are continuing to build our productivity when tasked with an independent learning activity.

Our amazing fraction/multiplication pizzas are also finished. Boy, were these a monster task, but well worth the effort! We have also returned to data collection, display and analysis, focusing on picture graphs. We have started completing some *Maths Mentals* work, allowing us to revisit a wide range of concepts more regularly and reinforce strategies to calculate problems. For the moment, we will aim for this once a week. Yesterday we also revisited our times table goals and moved on if needed. It has been fabulous to see how much work everyone has been putting into learning their tables at home; this is just invaluable.

In Science this week, the 3-6 students searched for heat sources around the school and decided if they were heat producers or heated by something else. The F-2 students discussed light sources and why some aspects of our classroom are lighter or darker than others.
