

As we are approaching the end of the year all of the children will undergo their end of year assessments in preparation for report writing. We will be looking at the start of year assessments and the end to see how much learning growth has occurred over 12 months. The reports are our way of showing you your child's progress against the Victorian Curriculum standards, the graph will show you 12 months growth. The staff provide written comments in four paragraphs; firstly to indicate how they have been socially, emotionally and behaviourally, next indicates their strengths in Literacy and areas for improvement, then the strengths and areas for improvement in Mathematics and finally their general interests and likes in Science, Music, Integrated Studies, P.E. and Japanese. Mrs French provides a comment about Art. We welcome feedback especially when we are reporting to parents. If there is something you don't understand or would like to see changed please let us know.

The students in Year Prep, One and Two have continued to work diligently even though they are missing Miss Blake. The two extra days off last week have renewed the students and they worked extremely well for the next three days. We are continuing to read the story 'Runt' and the students are showing an interest in listening to and understanding the unfamiliar words in the text.

In Maths the focus has been number recognition through the game of Number Bingo each day as well as following directions, data collection and display and the on-going development of skills to solve problems using the four operations.

Assessment time is upon us and the students will be completing testing in the core subject areas. This week we will complete the Spelling test and Miss Blake will continue testing in the following weeks.

Our focus in Literacy is reading fluency and comprehension, learning and reviewing spelling words and writing narrative texts. The students worked through the process of narrative writing last week and we are continuing to work on them this week to improve the students ability to create an interesting story that has a title, beginning, problem and solution.

In Technology all students will listen to and complete tasks about 'The Concrete Garden' and then use the ipads to record their task.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time with Miss Blake's class, they are hard-working, full of humour and a delight to teach.

Since our last newsletter, we have been working hard to tackle numerous tasks. We have explored various items for the upcoming concert, which helped us to finalise the acts. Be on the lookout for more details as we prepare more thoroughly.

Our engagement with Annie and Runt's story in Runt has intensified, captivating us throughout the book. We sneak in chapters whenever we get the chance and complete different related comprehension, vocabulary and writing tasks.

This week, our literacy and numeracy classes have been mainly used for assessments. We have noted significant growth throughout the year, and students are actively interested in their results and how much progress they have made.

In Science, our Grade 3 - 6 students focused on animal classification and attempted to classify various animals using the branching key.
