

In Maths, students are working on completing any unfinished pages in their books. We have also been completing some revision pages to see what has been learnt over the year. Lots of mental maths has been done to keep our brains working.

We had a lovely visit to the Nursing Home yesterday for some Christmas fun. It was a great way to finish off our visits for the year. It was a good start to all the Christmas activities we have coming up at school in the last 3 weeks of term.

As we approach the end of the year, things are getting quite hectic so please remember to check diaries carefully for any critical information. In our Literacy sessions, we're focusing on bringing our concert items to life. Students are expected to know their lines by heart, so practising at home would be very helpful. We've also explored some simple poetry, using Runt and Christmas as inspiration.

In Numeracy, we're working on a few different things. Some students are still finishing up the Maths Plus course, while others are moving on to a Christmas investigation - planning a hypothetical class Christmas party. This task integrates key concepts such as financial maths, percentages, fractions, data, and other number concepts. We're also using the last few weeks to revise all areas with mental maths warm-ups and sharing strategies through number talks.

In Science, students in grades 3-6 collected a leaf litter sample to observe and determine which animal groups were in the school garden. The P-2 students learned about the metamorphosis process through a butterfly's life cycle.


